Youth Day School Holiday (6 July)

8. As Youth Day, Monday, 6 July 2026, is a scheduled school holiday, students will return to school on Tuesday, 7 July 2026.

English Week (7 – 10 July)

9. From 7 to 10 July, our students will be participating in Fun Using English (FUe) — a week dedicated to celebrating the English language through creative and engaging activities. The aim of this programme is to nurture a love for English by providing meaningful opportunities for students to read, write, speak and express themselves creatively.

10. One of the highlights of the week is Book Character Day on 9 July. On this day, students are encouraged to dress up as their favourite book characters and share about them with their peers. This activity provides a wonderful platform for students to showcase their enthusiasm for reading. More details can be found in the Parents' Gateway letter sent on 29 May 2026. Throughout the week, students will also take part in a range of class-based activities and competitions, recess activities and an author's talk. These experiences are thoughtfully designed to make language learning enjoyable, purposeful, and inspiring.

National Education (NE) Show 2026 for P5 Students (18 July)

11. Our Primary 5 students will be given the opportunity to attend the National Education (NE) Show as part of the school's National Education programme on Saturday, 18 July 2026. First introduced in 1997, the NE Show aims to instil a strong sense of national pride and belonging in our students, while helping them appreciate the significance of Singapore's National Day. Held in conjunction with the full dress rehearsal of the National Day Parade, this programme provides a meaningful platform to deepen students' understanding of National Education values. All Primary 5 students are strongly encouraged to attend this event. Please refer to the Parents' Gateway (PG) letter dated 7 May 2026 for further details.

Racial Harmony Day (21 July)

12. QtPS will be commemorating Racial Harmony Day (RHD) on Monday, 21 July 2026. This year's theme, "Our People, Our Tapestry," highlights the importance of unity in diversity. Please note that students are not required to wear traditional attire for Racial Harmony Day and should attend school in their regular school uniform as they would on any usual school day. During the Form Teacher Guidance Period (FTGP) on that day, students will engage in meaningful activities designed to deepen their understanding of core values such as respect and empathy, and how these can be demonstrated in their daily interactions.

In addition, on Wednesday, 29 July 2026, the "My Little Chingay Float" Educational Truck will be stationed at Queenstown Primary School from 8.30 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. Students will have the opportunity to learn more about the Chingay Parade through a fun and interactive experience, participating in five engaging play zones as part of the discovery journey.

e-Learning Day and P6 Preliminary Oral Examinations (27 – 28 July)

14. Our P6 students will be having their P6 Preliminary English and Mother Tongue Oral Examinations on Monday, 27 July 2026 and Tuesday, 28 July 2026. P6 students will be given separate instructions and more details on this in due course.

15. In order to provide a conducive examination environment for our P6 students, P1 to P5 students will not be required to come to school on Monday, 27 July 2026 and Tuesday, 28 July 2026. They will be assigned e-learning tasks instead. More information will be provided by the respective subject teachers closer to the examination dates.
